The permit application has long been submitted to the County for the exterior renovation of Comfort Station 4. I spoke with the permitting office to try and speed things up, however, the slow wheels of County Government

continue to grind. Not sure if that conversation will help but I gave it a shot, so we'll see. Once the permit is issued I will set up the roofing for Comfort Stations 3 and 4.

I am still trying to obtain additional proposals to repair the retaining wall at the pavilion. Most contractors have been unresponsive and those that have responded initially have since gone silent. We do have one proposal from earlier in the year and I am reaching out to them for a site visit to go over the scope of work and make sure we are all on the same sheet of music.

We are researching our options to connect to reclaimed water and/or add a well pump for irrigation. If we are able to do that it will come with some upfront costs but it should significantly reduce our water consumption and sewerage charges.

Volunteers are a big part of the daily routine here at Ocean Resorts. As such, if anyone is interested in being added to the list let me know.

As you know, we are still in Hurricane season so please abide by By-Law 11.3.i Tie Downs. The end of season is typically the busiest time for tropical storms and hurricanes to develop so please ensure that all your items are properly stored.

Ocean Resorts Celebrates our Nonagenarians: Al Levesque

This month we are celebrating Joseph Maurice Albert Levesque, becoming one of our most recent residents to turn 90 years old! Nicknamed 'Al' because there were too many "Joes" in the army already, he was

born Thanksgiving Day of 1925 at his home in Lewiston, Maine to Raoul and Aurore $(B \circ s s e)$ Levesque. In fact, the turkey had to be removed from the table in order t o provide a spot for his birth!



Al had an older brother, Gerard, who is now deceased, and has a younger sister, Constance. He was educated at the St. Peter and Paul parochial school, Lewiston High School (class of 1944) and the University of Maine (class of 1950).

As a high school freshman on December 7, 1941, Al wanted to help his country. In the fall of 1943 he enlisted as an Army Air Force cadet, rather than be drafted after graduation, in order to choose his own career path.

After the Battle of the Bulge and D-Day, no new infantry troops were needed so as an enlisted Air Force cadet, Al was sent to Savannah, Georgia as an Air Operations Specialist.

A highlight of his military career was flying in a B-24 to Havana, Cuba and enjoying some nightlife with fellow cadets. A lowlight was escorting the body

of a fellow enlistedman back home to Holyoke, MA and presenting his mother with an American flag. Al was honorably discharged in 1946 with the rank of Sargent and professes that he "went in as a boy and came out as a man". Al then attended t h e University of Maine, graduating with a BA

in 1950. He married Joye Ann Cleveland in 1951 and they have four children, Linda, John, Mary and Jim, and two grandchildren, Ian London and Ellen London Crane.

Al was an Honor Ring Agent with Allstate Insurance from 1953-1992. He enjoys sports having skied, played tennis, golf and bocce, and loves sharing his Red Sox and Patriots with daughter Linda. Al and Joye have been Florida snowbirds in Ocean Resorts since 1994 and reside at Highland Green in Topsham, Maine during the summer months.

With Oktoberfest right around the corner, I'd like to suggest an authentic German restaurant in Melbourne Beach. CAFE COCONUT COVE, don't let the name fool you! This quaint little restaurant is on the left hand side of the road and sits along the Indian River. Reservations are a must in season and on weekends. It's very popular with locals and snowbirds. We always order the potato pancake appetizer. There are several very good Schnitzel dishes. The last time we were there we split a wonderful Roasted Pork Shank. Of course you must try the Apple Strudel Ala Mode! They have wine, German and domestic beers.

The THIRSTY CLAM is truly a locals hang out for fresh seafood. The owner told us nothing is fried - "go to the restaurant in front of his for that"! This little restaurant is super casual, with indoor and outdoor seating, occasional live music, and a full bar. I had a terrific



fresh hogfish dinner for \$14. Try any of the shrimp dishes! The seafood is sautéed, broiled or steamed. I also recommend you try one of their homemade chowders. The place has that "old Florida" atmosphere and the friendly owner, his wife and staff are welcoming.

camping area. The brochure in the post office has a coupon but we used our Enjoyment Book for half off savings. It is only 75 minutes south on

either I-95 exit 68 or FL Turnpike exit 97.



Want to take a scenic drive? I recommend the Martin Glade Road "Tunnel of Trees" on CR-714. Sally and Jim Kraszewski introduced us to this beautiful 12 mile stretch of road west of Palm City. Take I-95 to exit 110 and go west about 10 minutes.

From Route 1/Federal Highway in Stuart turn right onto CR-714 and drive about 30 minutes west. After the Tunnel of Trees you will end up near Lake Okeechobee. We had a late lunch at a local place, The Happy Hour Tavern and Grill. It is not much to look at but the food was good, the beer cold and the wait staff was friendly. We had country fried steak, with all the fixings for \$8.
